Dromoland Castle, Ireland



Before its reputation as a luxury stay, the O'Briens ruled Dromoland Castle for 900 years, until it was sold to Irish-American investors in 1987. Today, guests at Dromoland Castle in Ireland's County Clare (famous for the Cliffs of Moher) can enjoy a 5-star experience, which also includes an on-site golf course, 3 meeting rooms, and a reputable signature restaurant (that was once awarded a Michelin star)! Through the years, the hotel hosted plenty of famous guests, including notable figures like former US President George W. Bush, John Lennon, Nelson Mandela, and Muhammad Ali.
